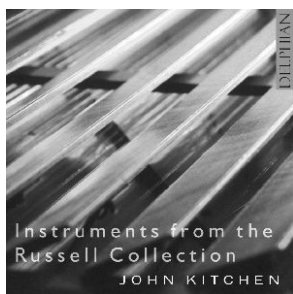

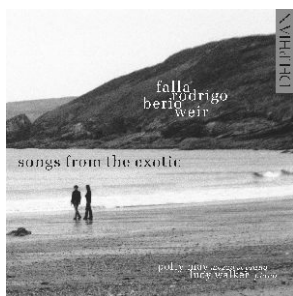


DCD 34001 Instruments from the Russell Collection

Susan Hamilton, soprano; John Cameron, piano

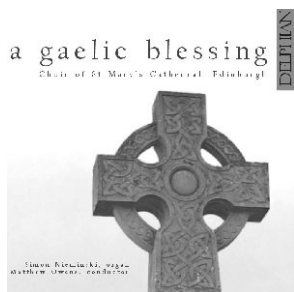

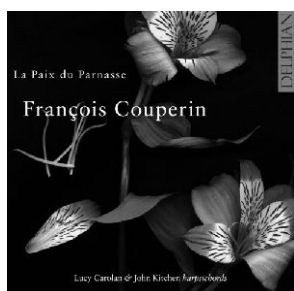


DCD 34011 Les plaisirs les plus charmantes

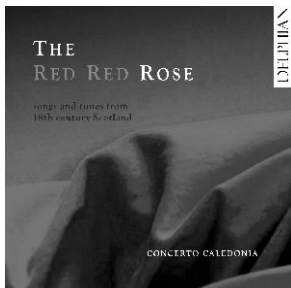

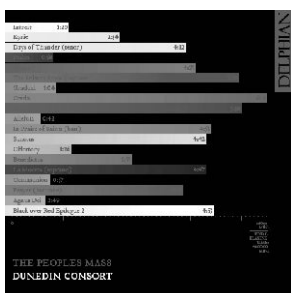


DCD 34017 Ascension

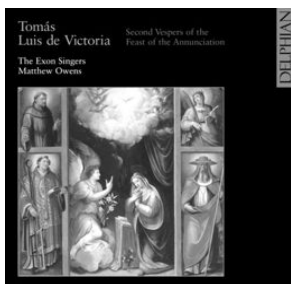
